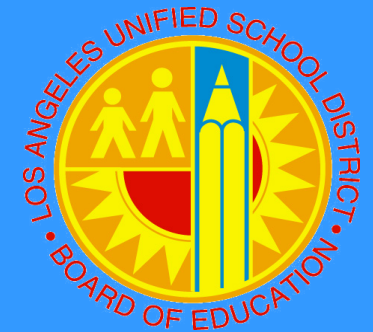

Court-Ordered Integration Programs*

All Integration Programs, including Magnet and PWT, were established by court order to address the Five Harms of Racial Isolation:

- Low Academic Achievement
- Low Self-Esteem
- Lack of Access to Postsecondary Opportunities
- Interracial Hostility and Intolerance
- Overcrowded Conditions

All participating students take the required coursework necessary for promotion and graduation, and have the opportunity to meet all requirements for entrance to the University of California and the California State Universities.

Public School Choice (PSC)*

The District, under the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001, offers the "Public School Choice" option to students attending a Program Improvement (PI) school and Schools At-Risk for PI. Students who attend a Program Improvement school will be offered the opportunity to transfer to a non-Program Improvement school. District-paid transportation is provided.

Gifted and Talented Programs/Schools For Advanced Studies (SAS)

The Los Angeles Unified School District provides programs for gifted/talented students in local resident schools and in schools offering advanced studies programs, as well as in Magnets. In addition, some of the schools, including gifted/high ability Magnets, also provide special programs for highly gifted students. Programs provide students with differentiated learning experiences beyond the core curriculum.
